



Powered TV Slide Operation Manual

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Introduction

This coach is equipped with a powered TV slide mechanism manufactured by Kwikkee Products. The powered TV slide is driven by a 12V DC motor using a rack and pinion system to provide positive movement of the slide system.

Operating Safety Precautions

Prior to extending or retracting your TV slide, take a moment to ensure the following:

1. Make sure that there are no obstacles on the outside of the TV that would interfere with the TV extending / retracting or could be damaged due to operation of the lift.
2. Check to ensure that any safety travel straps / bars have been removed.

Operating Your TV Lift

Please refer to your motor coach owners guide for operating information regarding this TV slide. Systems are installed during the manufacturing process and all units are not operated in the same manner.

Troubleshooting / Manual Mode

In the event the lift system fails to operate, check to ensure that adequate power is supplied to the motor. Refer to the coach owners documentation provided with the coach for fuse locations.

If it is determined that the drive motor has failed and you need to extend or retract the system it will be necessary to remove the drive motor.

Once the drive motor is removed the TV slide can move freely. On units that extend vertically the unit must be supported prior to removal of the drive motor to prevent injury or damage to the TV. In all cases the TV slide should be secured prior to coach travel if the drive motor has been removed.



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
