Purpose

This document outlines the procedure for replacing/installing a 2000 series window vented exit picture window handle.

NOTE: Images used in this document are for reference only when assembling, installing and/or operating this product. Actual appearance of provided and/or purchased parts and assemblies may differ.

Procedure

1. Extend the window handle into the open position (Fig. 1A).
2. Remove the screen by pulling the red tab (Fig. 1B) away from the window. Pull the screen (Fig. 1C) up and out and set aside to reinstall.

NOTE: Take caution when removing the screws from the yoke bracket that the window does not slam back against the frame.

3. Locate the yoke bracket (Fig. 2A) and remove the two screws (Fig. 2B). Place the screws aside to reinstall.

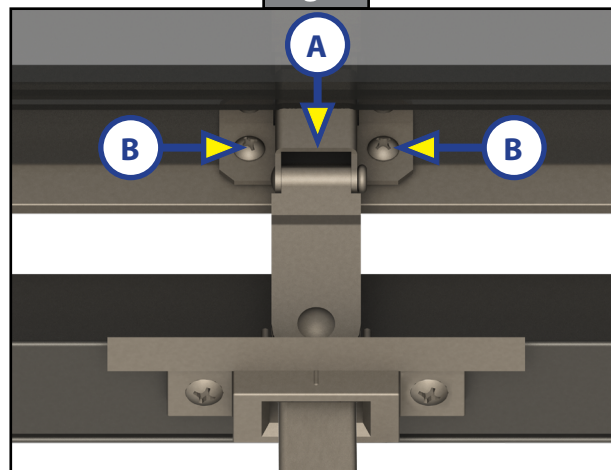
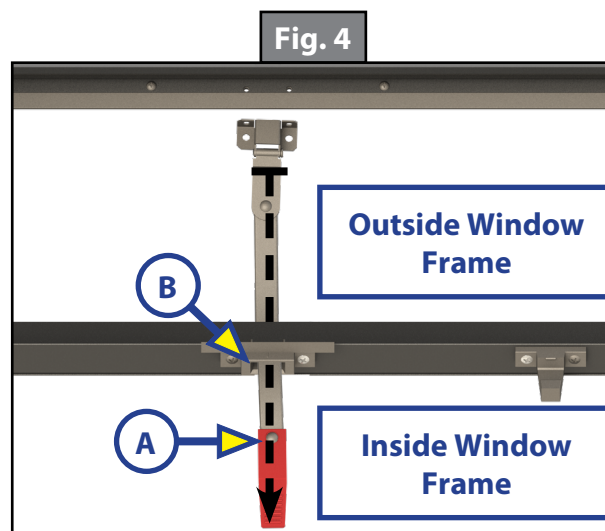
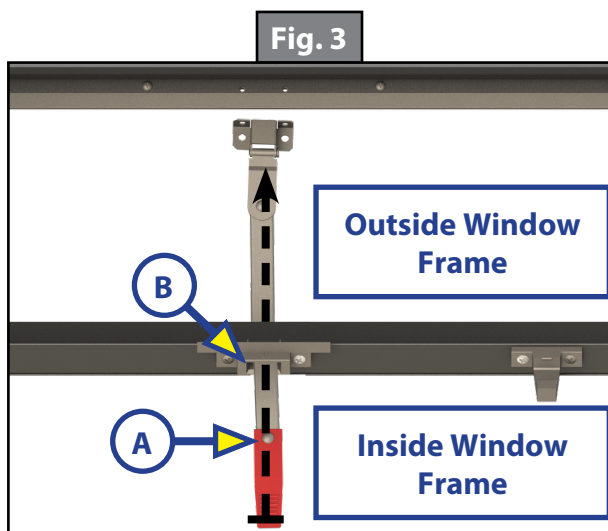

4. Slide the handle assembly (Fig. 3A) towards the outside of the unit, through the plastic support bracket (Fig. 3B).
5. Install the new handle assembly (Fig. 4A) in the opposite direction of step 4, sliding the handle assembly through the plastic support bracket (Fig. 4B) towards the inside of the unit.



6. Reinstall the previously removed screws (Fig. 2B) into the yoke bracket (Fig. 2A).
7. Reinstall the screen (Fig. 1C) into the window frame.
8. Close the window by moving the handle assembly (Fig. 5A) into closed and locked position (Fig. 5B).
