Introduction

This document is intended to assist with the identification of a customer's LCI leveling system.

Identification Steps

1. Does the touchpad state LCI Electronic Leveling or is the system otherwise branded with the LCI logo (Fig. 1)?
 - A. If no, product is not made by Lippert Components.
 - B. If yes, continue to step 2.

2. Is the unit a motorized, 5th wheel, or travel trailer?
 - A. If motorized, continue to step 3.
 - B. If 5th wheel, continue to step 4.
 - C. If travel trailer, continue to step 5.
3. Motorized: Does the leveling system's touchpad have an LCD screen or is it made up entirely of lights and buttons?
 - A. If there is an LCD screen (Figs. 2 and 3), leveling system is: Motorized Level-Up® leveling system.

NOTE: Systems purchased before 2018 will have a black LCD touchpad, shown in Fig. 3.

- B. If touchpad is all lights and buttons (Fig. 4), leveling system is: Motorized Standard Leveling system.

4. 5th wheel: Is the leveling system electric or hydraulic?
 - A. If electric, are the front and rear jack legs all square or are the rear jack legs round?
 - I. If all jack legs are square (Fig. 5), leveling system is: Ground Control® 2.0 leveling system.
 - II. If rear jacks legs are round (Fig. 6), leveling system is: Ground Control 3.0 leveling system.
 - a. Does the leveling system utilize an LCD touchpad or a OneControl™ touch panel?
 - i. If LCD touchpad (Figs. 8 and 9), leveling system is Ground Control® 3.0 leveling system with LCD touchpad.

NOTE: Systems purchased before 2018 will have a black LCD touchpad, shown in Fig. 9.

- ii. If OneControl™ touch panel (Fig. 10), leveling system is: Ground Control® 3.0 leveling system with OneControl™ touch panel.
 - B. If hydraulic (Fig. 7), leveling system is: Hydraulic Towable Level-Up®.
 - I. Does leveling system utilize an LCD touchpad or a OneControl™ touch panel?
 - a. If LCD touchpad (Figs. 8 and 9), leveling system is: Hydraulic Towable Level-Up® with LCD touchpad.

NOTE: Systems purchased before 2018 will have a black LCD touchpad, shown in Fig. 9.

- b. If OneControl™ touch panel (Fig. 10), leveling system is: Hydraulic Towable Level Up® with OneControl™ touch panel.

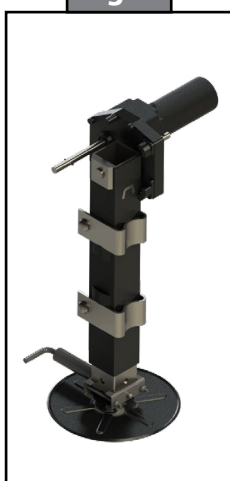

5. Travel trailer: Is the leveling system electric or hydraulic?
 - A. If electric (Figs. 11 or 12), leveling system is: Ground Control® Travel Trailer leveling system.
 - I. Does leveling system utilize an LCD touchpad or a OneControl™ touch panel?
 - a. If LCD touchpad (Figs. 14 and 15), leveling system is: Ground Control® Travel Trailer leveling system with LCD touchpad.
 - B. If hydraulic (Fig. 13), leveling system is: Travel Trailer Level-Up® with LCD touchpad (Figs. 14 and 15).

NOTE: Systems purchased before 2018 will have a black LCD touchpad, shown in Fig. 15.

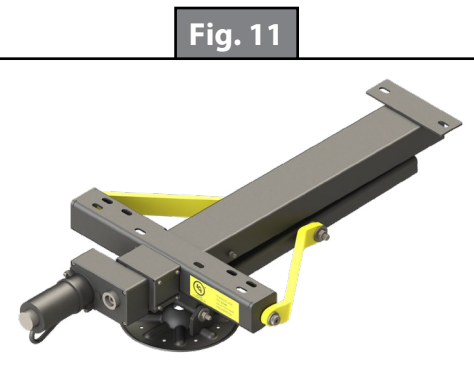

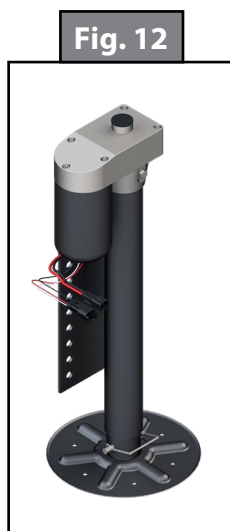

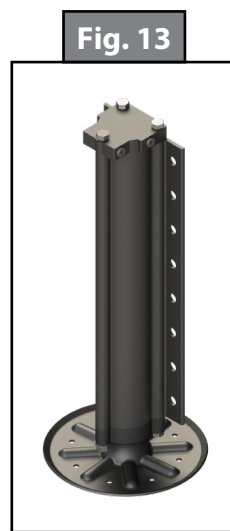
