

DOORS

Purpose

The purpose of this document is to outline the procedure to remove the outermost door panels to allow customers to transport their wider SXS (side-by-side) four-wheelers. The procedure outlines the removal of the door panels, not the actual door jamb.

Safety

⚠ CAUTION

Moving parts can pinch, crush or cut. Keep clear and use caution.

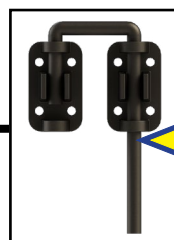
Resources Required

- Cordless or electric drill or screw gun or Phillips head screwdriver
- Appropriate drive bits
- One to two people, depending on the task

Procedure

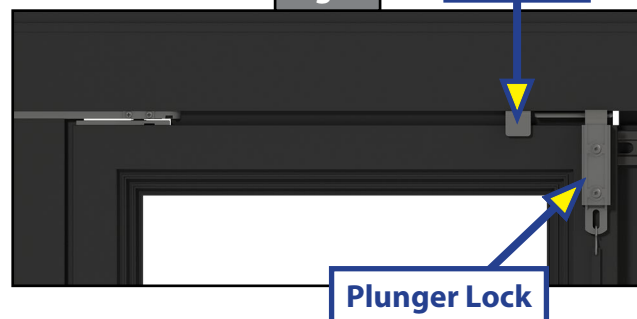
1. Release the latch located on the interior center of door frame, near the handles (Fig. 1).
2. Slide both left and right doors towards the exterior walls of the trailer.
3. After sliding back center door panels, release plunger latches located on the exterior along the top of the outermost panels (Fig. 2).

Release Latch

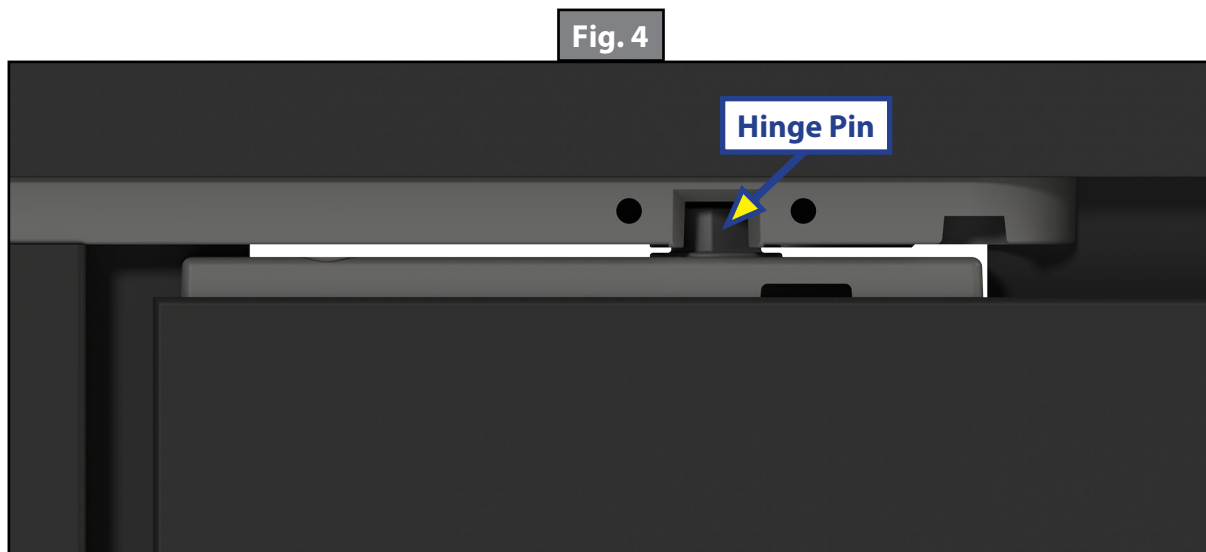

4. Standing on the interior side of the doors, locate the hinge plate on top of each door (Fig. 3).
5. Locate the two mounting screws which hold the hinge plate cover in place (Fig. 3). Remove the screws.
6. Remove the hinge plate cover.
7. The door hinge pin should be visible (Fig. 4).
8. Pulling inward, open door to 45 degrees of the door frame.
9. Pull the top of the door towards the interior, sliding the hinge pin through the hinge plate slot.
10. Lift and remove the door.
11. Repeat steps 4-10 on opposite door.

NOTE: Doors, screws and hinge plate covers can be stored in trailer or storage area until reinstalled. The hinge plate does not need to be reinstalled because it is only added to make sure the doors do not come off during installation.





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
