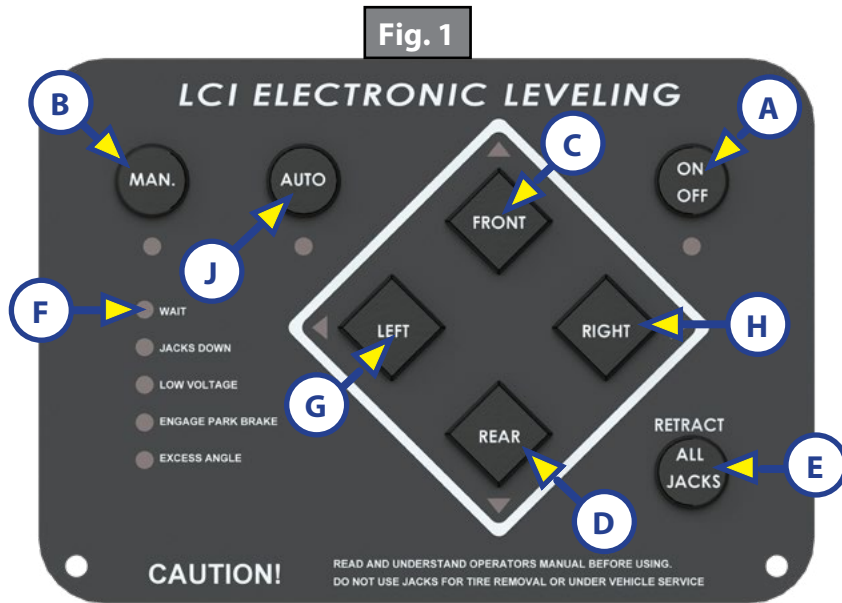


LEVELING AND STABILIZATION

Purpose

This document outlines the process for setting zero point for hydraulic leveling on a 4 point/4valve sprinter.



Procedure

1. Turn system on by pressing the "ON/OFF" (Fig. 1A). The "ON/OFF" indicator light will illuminate.
2. Press and hold the "MAN" button (Fig. 1B) until the indicator light below the "MAN" button illuminates. This should take approximately 3 seconds.
3. Level the coach in "MANUAL" mode by using a carpenter's level on the floor. Level front to rear and then left to right.
 - A. Push the "FRONT" (Fig. 1C) button until jacks contact the ground and lift the front of the coach 1-2 inches.
 - B. Push "REAR" (Fig. 1D) button until jacks contact the ground and lift rear of coach. Keep button depressed until the carpenter's level bubble is centered.
 - C. Push "LEFT" (Fig. 1G) and "RIGHT" (Fig. 1H) buttons until level bubble is centered.
4. Turn Touch Pad "OFF" (Fig. 1A).
5. With the coach leveled, press "FRONT" (Fig. 1C) 5 times.
6. Press "REAR" (Fig. 1D) 5 times. At this time all lights on the touch pad will flash with the exception of the ON/OFF indicator, which will remain solidly lit.
7. The touch pad is now in zero mode. If the coach has come out of its level condition, it can be reset into level condition by following the procedure outlined in step 3.
8. With the coach in level condition, simultaneously press the "RETRACT ALL JACKS" (Fig. 1E) button and the "AUTO" (Fig. 1J) button to store this as the Zero Level Point reference.
9. The "WAIT" light (Fig. 1F) only will flash for approximately 5 seconds. After this, the control will emit an audible beep and revert back to normal operation mode. Zero Point calibration is now complete.
