

AWNINGS

Purpose

The Solera® Awning Center Support works with both power and manual Solera® RV awning assemblies and supports the roller assembly when in the travel position. The Solera® Awning Center Support automatically accepts and releases the roller assembly as it extends or retracts. The Solera® Awning Center Support is required for awnings measuring 22' or over to add support and stability when traveling from destination to destination.

Resources Required

- Cordless or electric drill or screw gun
- Appropriate drive bit
- #10 screws (2)
- Tape measure
- Method of non-permanent marking
- Silicone sealant

Preparation

Awning installation must be complete prior to installing the Solera® Awning Center Support.

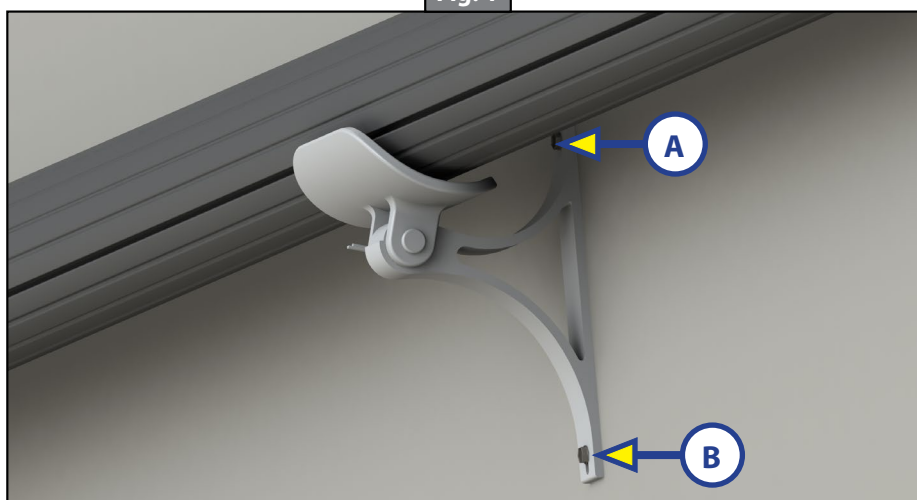
Instructions

1. Measure and mark the center location of the roll tube.
2. Hold the center support up to the awning with the tube resting in the cradle of the support.
3. Slide the center support up until the roll tube has been raised between $\frac{1}{8}$ " to $\frac{3}{16}$ ".

NOTE: The roll tube may not appear perfectly straight. This is not a defect. Raising the awning to attempt to make it straight could interfere with normal operation.

4. Install one OEM supplied #10 screw into the bottom hole in the center support bracket (Fig. 1B).
5. Extend the awning half way to gain access to the top of the center support bracket.
6. Install the top #10 screw in the center support bracket (Fig. 1A).
7. Seal fastener locations to protect against water intrusion.
